



Virginia Survey Results

Q1 The Affordable Medicine Act, a bill that passed the General Assembly in March with nearly unanimous bipartisan support, would expand the Medicare-negotiated lower prices at the state level, making the lower Medicare cost the cost for state-regulated insurance on at least 40 drugs. Do you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose, or strongly oppose this bill?

<i>Strongly support</i>	64%

Q2 The Affordable Medicine Act is now on Gov. Spanberger's desk to sign or veto by May 22nd after the General Assembly rejected her proposal to require the bill to pass again in 2027 to go into effect. Do you think the Governor should sign the Affordable Medicine Act into law this year, or not?

Q3 If Governor Spanberger vetoed the Affordable Medicine Act, would that make you feel much more favorably, somewhat more favorably, somewhat less favorably, or much less favorably towards her, or would it not make a difference?

Q10 If you are 18-45 years old, press 1. If 46-65, press 2. If older than 65, press 3.
